Heggie's after hearing the purpose of Pat's request, jumped in and donated the pizzas themselves! What a lovely circle of caring.

Move on a couple of months and Pat again contacted Heggie's Pizza to purchase and donate additional pizzas. To her surprise Heggie's informed her that they had put the Ronald McDonald House on a regular rotation of pizza delivery at no charge.

Thanks to Pat's pioneer spirit of seeing a need and moving to meet it, she inspired further good actions and there is pizza on the menu now and then for people who return each day tired and hungry to their temporary home.
