The Legacy West Annual Christmas Stocking Project

Hosted by the Auraria Pioneers



Our 2023 theme is "Fill Our Lives With Joy"

This event has been held yearly for over 30 years and our councils are proud and honored that we have another opportunity to host this activity and partner with the Family Tree House of Hope and The GOALs project.

Auraria had the privilege of delivering stockings to the Family Tree House of Hope and The GOALs facility. The tenacity and effort displayed from the Auraria team made Christmas day a little brighter for many families at these two facilities.

Residential Facility for Women with Children Experiencing Homelessness:

The Family Tree House of Hope is dedicated to providing safe shelter and supportive services for women with children experiencing homelessness.

These families find a safe place to stay while they begin to get back on their feet.

The GOALS program is a Two-Generation (2Gen) housing program for families experiencing homelessness from Aurora and Arapahoe County. GOALS provides families a private room while they develop long-term goals for stability self-reliance. Families are provided a safe space for four to nine months, and one-year of follow-up support.

The Auraria Pioneers team provided sleeping bags to the youth at Urban Peak.

Annually Auraria works with the staff at Urban Peak to identify current needs and provide supplies and transportation (bus passes) to the youth to support their journey to attaining self-sufficiency.

Urban Peak ignites the potential in youth to exit homelessness and create self-determined, fulfilled lives. The vision of Urban Peak is that all Colorado youth have safe housing, supportive relationships, and the opportunity for self-sufficiency and success.



Chapter 67 Utah/ Wyoming



We had a fairly good year with our groups all working hard.

- ♦ The chapter collected and distributed over 200 sets of golf clubs balls and bags(and more to deliver this summer) for the schools all over Utah to be able to learn the game but could't afford the equipment. All summer we put together sets and delivered them.
- We also worked with the foodbanks here with a group of young kids teaching them about volunteering and giving back. One of the mothers arranges for us the dates and times and its a blast for the kids aged 6 to 14 and grandparents, aunts, uncles and friends. Groups are very specific so we don't have more than 20 at a time so we're all safe and the public can't come in while were there. It's such a wonderful project we all look forward to doing. We do this once, sometimes twice a month.
- ♦ A special volunteer teaches "T"golf and takes seniors golfing when they're able to get out.
- ♦ He also helps with a group that takes veterans fishing during the summer when the weather is good.
- One of our group of volunteers, headed by Claudeed, has put in over 22,000 (twenty-two-thousand hours in 2023) making quilts for our Wyoming groups as well as Utah groups.
- ♦ We collect pop tabs for Ronald McDonald House,
- ♦ used eye glasses for the Drs Without Borders through the Lyons Club,
- ♦ And items for our animal shelters in the community (the rolls left after you use up your hand towels and toilet paper) and toys for the kittens and little pups.



The Chapter holds a golf tournament every year in March to benefit Junior Achievement of Utah. Our golf team is usually about 48 to 50 people. Everyone is welcome to play friends, family, active employees or retirees from AT&T and all the bell companies. This year the tournament will take place on February 23.

The Charm Shop

The CHARM shop fulfills the community's need for no cost





therapeutic devices for children with physical disabilities through its woodworking shop. CHARM is an acronym for "Children Helped and Rehabilitation Motivated." The CHARM Shop was established in 1983.

The CHARM Shop has produced and distributed over 36,000 therapeutic devices to 25 agencies. Throughout its thirty-six years, the New Outlook Southwest council has continued to consult with local therapists and agencies to determine both ongoing and changing needs with regard to therapeutic devices. Pioneer CHARM Shop offers a catalog of over one hundred standard therapeutic devices. The devices are available to all state and local therapists as well as individuals at no cost. The cost of materials is provided by a variety of project sponsors solicited by the Pioneers.

The CHARM shop is currently furnished operational space (including a 3500 sq ft shop and free utilities) to fabricate our products. We in turn help with the building maintenance and personnel needs of our benefactors, Seasons Memory Care (an Alzheimer's facility) and One Community Hospice in Kansas City Missouri. In providing this help we impact the lives of the patients under the care of these businesses.

A large donation was made to The Women's Center with additional funding for the project from the TelecomPioneers Mackenzie Grant

metra that then distributes the items to the needy. The women continue to make all these things at home and meet once a month to turn in what they have made.
